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## MAINTENANCE CORNER



One of the primary challenges the maintenance team faces is that our hours are limited to Monday through Friday from 7:00 AM to 12:00 PM. Accordingly, as a team we have to be very intentional about the work that gets our attention.

In the community coffee, I outlined the Maintenance team's response hierarchy by evaluating every incoming work order request through what is called the 'Eisenhower Box', named after Dwight D. Eisenhower, 34<sup>th</sup> president of the United States.

Here's how the Maintenance team is beginning to use the Eisenhower Box to evaluate work requests.

### 1. Urgent and Important.

These are tasks that the maintenance team does immediately. Water line breaks, exploding sewer lines, natural disasters, etc. You have our full attention and we are doing everything we can to perform triage and mitigate the potential damages this might cost the village.

The exception to this rule is if there is a fire, electrical outage, or some kind of safety issue that might endanger lives. In those instances, please call 911 or if it's an electrical issue, please call Duke Energy at 1-800-228-8485.

### 2. Important, but not urgent.

These are tasks the Maintenance team schedules to do later. Pressure washing Village owned properties, painting interior and exterior, replacing roofs and gutters, replacing windows, planting trees, replacing or repairing broken items, general maintenance and upkeep, etc. The vast majority of

work order requests for the Village are in this category. Most issues can be put on the schedule to be resolved in a timely manner, usually within 2 weeks, but sometimes sooner.

### 3. Urgent, but not important.

These are tasks the Maintenance team outsources to outside contractors. HVAC issues, plumbing issues, appliance issues, electrical issues, Pest Control, etc. While many of the maintenance team has the ability to resolve some of these issues, because they are urgent, outside contractors are used because they can typically respond quicker than our team can.

### 4. Neither Urgent nor Important.

These are tasks that the Maintenance team tries to eliminate from our plate and ask the Village to help each other out with. Some examples might be unlocking doors, plugged toilets and sinks, moving furniture, replacing light bulbs, etc. For items like these, please ask your neighbors for help first before reaching out to members of the Maintenance team or submitting a work request.

As I explained in the Community Coffee, it's not a perfect system, but it does provide a foundational basis for evaluating the work requests as they come in.

**MAILBOXES**

A roof is planned to be installed over the new mailboxes at the Elliott Center. The contractor will not be able to begin the work until December/January.

**When you arrive back in the village:**

1. If you have a US mailbox outside your residence, be sure to leave a note for the mail carrier letting her know your names and that you're here now so she'll know to leave your mail.
2. If you've been given a mailbox outside the Elliott Center, look inside and fill out the green form found there. If it's missing, just place a note inside giving your name and address saying you're here now.

**MISSING SUPPLIES**

Products in the laundry and public rest rooms are for use in that facility. Please do not take rolls of toilet paper, paper towels, or the cleaning products for your home! If you need assistance, please contact the Office.

**STRAY ANIMALS**

We have received several complaints about stray cats here in the Village. Do NOT feed any stray or wild animals! Please call Hernando County Animal Services at 352-796-5062.



Pets are to be kept inside the residence. When a pet is temporarily taken outside, the pet owner must adhere to *County Code Sec. 6-24* (restraint).

**PET REMINDER**

Please do not put dog poo in the trash cans in the public restrooms! It is unsanitary and stinks! Please put it in the dumpster or take it home to your own trash!

According to Florida law, golf carts may not be driven on public roads or highways. Roads inside Wesleyan Village are private, not public. Redbud is a public road. DO NOT drive your golf cart on Redbud Lane!!!! Please drive with care for the safety of pedestrians, obey all traffic laws (which includes stop signs, speed limits, one-way streets, etc.) and avoid excessive noise. Drivers of golf carts are encouraged to pull to the side of the road and acknowledge the other vehicle, wave to the other driver of that other vehicle that they may proceed past you.

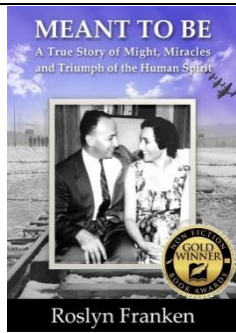
#### Distributions

## FROM THE BOARD ROOM



*Note: There was no Board meeting in the month of October. With no board action to report, I am instead reflecting on the past fiscal year of Wesleyan Village.*

A generation ago, the folk-rock artist Bob Dylan wrote “The times they are a changin’”. Even a casual observer of our world might wish to revise those lyrics to say – the times, *they have changed!* Change comes at us in exponential waves these days. At times, those waves may even seem overwhelming. Without a rock to which we may cling, who knows where we might be?

I am sensitive to the fact that Wesleyan Village has gone through a significant amount of change this past year. Of our eleven staff positions (not including our hourly employees), eight of these persons have joined us within the past twenty months. That is a tremendous amount of change for any organization to absorb. I am so grateful to you as a community that you have welcomed these persons and have acknowledged the positive impact they are having on our village. As I sat back and observed our most recent community coffee, I felt an overwhelming sense that

God has placed the people of His choosing in these positions of ministry at this time.

Isn’t it great to have a Community Manager who can focus her expertise and experience on the daily management of our village? Isn’t it inspiring to have a Community Chaplain who brings decades of a pastoral heart and vision to focus on the spiritual life of our membership? Isn’t it encouraging to witness staff who are enthusiastic about their ministry in Wesleyan Village?
